(La Boheme, Magic Flute), and Old Globe in San Diego (Forever Plaid). She worked with Tony Award winning costume designers Martin Pakledinez and Zack Brown. She built costumes for dozens of film and television projects in Hollywood. She worked with Emmy Award winning costume designers Robert Blackman and Kathy O'Rear, and Academy Award nominated costume designers Aggie Guerard Rodgers and Arianne Philips, among others. She is a member of IATSE Local 705 Motion Picture Costumers in LA, as a costume manufacturing foreperson. She attended FIDM in LA, and London College of Fashion. On Maui, she collaborated with Eric Gilliom on his costumes for White Hawaiian and Rocky Horror. She is the Costume Director for Alexander Academy of Performing Arts (Midsummer Night's Dream, Swan Lake, and The Nutcracker Ballet performed at the MACC). She was the Costume Director for Seussical at Maui OnStage. She and her husband, artist Craig Mullins, have lived on Maui since 2001, raising Micah and Sara Oberg with pride and joy. www.jenniferoberg.com

About The Sewing Hui:

The Sewing Hui's mission is to serve the Maui community by creating sewn items for nonprofit organizations in need. The Sewing Hui volunteers are a dedicated team of 100+ residents and visitors who create and sew a variety of projects for Maui. The Sewing Hui was founded by Jennifer Oberg. The first project was in 2020, making 10,000 medical-grade masks for Maui's healthcare providers and first responders. The volunteers have created over 30,000 items for 60 organizations. Their sewing initiatives benefit keiki, kūpuna, healthcare providers, hospice care, shelters, birthing communities, schools, senior centers, performing arts organizations and other community groups. After the August 2023 wildfire, The Sewing Hui made and collected over 3000 hand-made pillowcases for distribution to shelters, and provided 500 hand-made Christmas stockings to children in need. The resident-volunteers are deeply invested in supporting their island home. The visitor-volunteers who join the sewing sessions want to give back to Maui during their stay. www.thesewinghui.com

About the playwright

Ken Ludwig has had six productions on Broadway and eight in London's West End. His 34 plays and musicals are staged around the world and throughout the United States every night of the year.

His first play, Lend Me a Tenor, won two Tony Awards and was called "one of the classic comedies of the 20th century" by The Washington Post. Crazy For You is currently running on London's West End. It was previously on Broadway for five years, on the West End for three, and won the Tony and Olivier Awards for Best Musical.

In addition, he has won the Edwin Forrest Award for Contributions to the American Theatre, two Laurence Olivier Awards, two Helen Hayes Awards, the Charles MacArthur Award and the Edgar Award for Best Mystery of the Year. His other plays include Moon Over Buffalo, Leading Ladies, Baskerville, Sherwood, Twentieth Century, Dear Jack, Dear Louise, A Fox on the Fairway, A Comedy of Tenors, The Game's Afoot, Shakespeare in Hollywood and Murder on the Orient Express. They have starred, among others, Alec Baldwin, Carol Burnett, Kristen Bell, Tony Shaloub, Joan Collins and Henry Goodman.

His book How to Teach Your Children Shakespeare, published by Penguin Random House, won the Falstaff Award for Best Shakespeare Book of the Year, and his essays on theatre are published in the Yale Review. He gives the Annual Ken Ludwig Playwriting Scholarship at the Kennedy Center American College Theater Festival, and he served on the Board of Governors for the Folger Shakespeare Library for ten years. His first opera, Tenor Overboard, opened at the Glimmerglass Festival in July 2022. His most recent world premieres were Lend Me A Soprano and Moriarty, and his newest plays and musicals include Pride and Prejudice Part 2: Napoleon at Pemberley and Lady Molly of Scotland Yard.

His plays include commissions from the Agatha Christie Estate, the Royal Shakespeare Company, The Old Globe Theatre, and the Bristol Old Vic. For more information visit <u>www.kenludwig.com</u>.

Paul Jackel (Hercule Poirot) Paul is pleased to be back at Maui OnStage, where he was first introduced to local audiences in 2022's The Importance of Being Earnest. Since that time, he has appeared in a half-dozen productions at both MAPA and ProArts Playhouse, including The Lion in Winter, and Bent. Before moving to the island, Paul enjoyed a career of 25+ years as an actor/singer in NYC, making his Broadway debut in the original cast of The Secret Garden. Other NYC credits include A Christmas Carol (Fred opposite Scrooge Roddy McDowall), Side by Side by Sondheim, The Last Starfighter, and The Fantasticks! (El Gallo in a production directed by author Tom Jones). He performed leading roles in the national tours of Legally Blonde, The Secret Garden, Into the Woods (The Wolf/Cinderella's Prince), and Camelot (standby for Robert Goulet as Arthur). He is featured on the OC recordings of Garden, Starfighter, and Shlomo. Favorite roles in regional theatre include Daddy Warbucks in Annie (featuring comedian Wanda Sykes as Miss Hannigan), Father in Ragtime (Fulton Opera House), and Tito Merelli in Lend Me a Tenor (Olney Theatre Center).

Francis Tau'a (Monsieur Bouc) Francis was last seen playing Sancho in MAPA's Man of La Mancha on the Castle Theater stage at the MACC. He is an acting instructor with Maui OnStage's Education and Youth program, and has co-directed productions with Tina Kailiponi. He has worked professionally with the Utah Shakespeare Festival, as well as ProArts Maui, where he directed Dial M for Murder, A Christmas Carol, and the recent Lovey Lee.

Jamie Nicole Wilcox (Mary Debenham) Jamie loves getting to work with Maui OnStage and perform. You last saw her at the Historic Iao Theater as Tilly in She Kills Monsters in 2022. She was most recently Nicola in the ProArts Playhouse production of Kinky Boots. She looks forward to taking the stage once again with this killer cast. Enjoy!

Aaron Pardini (Hector MacQueen) Aaron has an AA Degree in Fine Arts, Majoring in Dance from Orange Coast College. Aaron performed in the tap companies Rhapsody in Taps and Tap Overload in SoCal (2012-2017). Maui works include *Something Rotten!* (2023) as an ensemble member, Bard Boy, and Robin, *The Rocky Horror Show* (2023) as Columbia, *The Reluctant Elf* (2023) as the choreographer, *Kinky Boots* (2024) as Angel, *Seussical the Musical* (2024) as the Cat in the Hat, and *Finding Formal Expression* (2024). He teaches tap at Momentum Dance Maui. As an instructor at Waikapu Danceworks, he teaches flexibility and conditioning, pole, tap, dance foundations, and musical theater. **Dale Button** (Michel the Conductor, Understudy Head Waiter) Dale is loving every minute of working with this talented cast under the direction of Kalani Whitford. Last seen as General Genghis Kahn Schmitz in the smash summer hit musical Seussical, Dale has walked the boards of Maui stages since 1993. When he's not in rehearsals or performing, you can find him waiting tables at Haliimaile General Store for lunch Tuesday through Friday, or just chilling at home in Makawao with his kitty Kinkers. He would like to dedicate his performances to his late mother, Arlene Button, who passed away in May of this year. She was truly his biggest fan.

Jonathan Salcedo-Viola (Head Waiter, Understudy Hector MacQueen, Understudy Michel the Conductor) Jonathan is so happy to return to the lao stage after 13 years since appearing in 2011's Cats. He was last seen in this year's production of Kinky Boots at ProArts Playhouse. Merci et bon voyage!

Marsi Smith (Princess Dragomiroff) Marsi is extremely happy to be back on the lao Theater stage. Since moving to Maui she has been in many plays including Jekyll and Hyde, Mary Poppins, Dirty Rotten Scoundrels, Dial M for Murder, Harvey, Cabaret, Other Desert Cities, Avenue Q, Mamma Mia, The Graduate, and recently her one-woman show Songs from my Closet. He graduated from Seabury Hall, where he was regularly involved with their music and drama departments. Most recently, Brendan performed multiple roles in the sold out production of Kinky Boots at ProArts Playhouse.

Bill Pannell (Samuel Ratchett, Understudy Colonel Arbuthnot) Bill is thrilled to be making his Maui debut after moving here this summer to be near family members. Before a successful career as a trial lawyer in Georgia, Bill had extensive experience in the theater as an actor, teacher, and director which included study with Lee Strasberg in Hollywood. He stayed active in Atlanta in television and film while practicing law and raising a family. His favorite roles include King Arthur, Becket, Lord Byron, Bill Sykes, and Herschel Featherbottom. His most famous student, RuPaul, credits Bill with giving him the most important advice he ever received – "Don't take yourself too seriously".

Teagan Schobel (Daisy Armstrong) Teagan lives on Maui with her family and four cats, and attends Kihei Charter School. She is in the 3rd grade, and her favorite subjects are art and PE. Teagan first appeared on stage as Lobster Number 2 in Rainbow Fish. She was also Rumplestiltskin and Ducky Lucky in The Stinky Cheese Man. She was Tickle the Dog in Junie B. Jones, and played Cindy Lou Who in Seussical. Most recently she was Baby Bear in Once Upon a Crime, the Trial of Goldilocks. Teagan also enjoys gymnastics, basketball, and hanging out with her friends. Teagan would like to thank her grandparents, her mom, dad, and sister Adelaide for their love and support. A huge thank you to Miss Tina for recommending her for this part! Finally, thank you to Kiana, Bianca, and Brenda Haugg for introducing her to the world of Maui OnStage.

Brian Patrick Connolly (Understudy Hercule Poirot) Brian is fresh off the stage with the play Art (at ProArts Playhouse on Maui), where he produced, directed, did stage/costume/light/sound design, and played the role of Marc. Brian made his Historic Iao Theater debut as Max in Lend Me A Tenor, and was last seen on the Iao stage in Misery as Paul Sheldon. In between these two, he walked these boards as Ebenezer Scrooge in Scrooge, Bob Cratchit in A Christmas Carol, Mr. White in Reservoir Dogs, Billis in South Pacific, and Roat in Wait Until Dark, among others. Connolly is honored to be an understudy for Paul Jackel as Poirot, but hopes not to have to come on, because Paul is terrific.
